Meeting Minutes for May 9, 2011 - Fire House #4, Missoula

Meeting Called to order by Eric, NZ7S at 7pm

Program: Presentation by Tim Marchant – TOSRV – 41st^t Annual TOSRV, HARC has been involved in most if not all of the rides for this event. Format and route will be the same as it has in the past few years, the numbers of riders are down (presently 75 to 80 riders) this year largely due to weather. May 21st and 22nd. Tim is leaving signs for vehicles and folders that have emergency contact information, emergency procedures. The folders don't have the map yet, that will be distributed when the tour starts, he will also have an updated list of all the participants. The BMW motorcycle club will also be participating, Missoula Bike Works will be doing repairs. REI representative will also participate, but he will be riding a bike in the event, so his availability will be primarily to those riders near him. Finally, Tim also has a donation check for the club to help with club expenses etc.

Secretaries Report— Mike, AE7MH Presentation of meeting minutes for April 11, 2011 as published by Todd, K2GCN. The following corrections need to be noted: Membership report listed 61 paying members, this should have been listed as 42 paid members and 3 life members. Bill, W4YMA was listed as contact for the TOSRV event, this should have been listed at Bob, N7MSU. With these corrections noted a motion made to accept the meeting minutes from April 11th by Bill, W4YMA and seconded by Byron, NN8A. Motion passed.

Treasurers Report— Jerry, N7GE Started month with \$1504.51 in checking, received \$70 from W5YI exams, \$80 dues paid, \$10 sale of equipment (listed as donation) for a total of \$160 income. Expenses are \$1.39 for mailing W5YI exam paperwork, pay \$35 W5YI exam fees, \$52.84 triathlon dinner, , \$15 file renewal of 2010 501C3 tax status, \$1235.90 for antenna for the '04 machine and \$14.25 for copies of W5YI testing materials. This leaves us a checking balance of \$310.13. Motion to accept treasurers report made by Dean, N7DLP and was seconded by Paul, N7PAS. Motion passed.

Committee Reports

Membership — Liz, WG7E Not present.

Repeater — Eric, NZ7S – no report to give, but do have pictures of repeater site for '90 machine and area surrounding, looking at the pictures, most significant is the amount of snow showing around the site. BJ, KD7HP – comment, most snow seen at site in 34 years. Byron, NN8A – comment, APRS and PACKET antenna's are completely buried in the snow, resulting in difficulty using these services.

PROPOSED CONSTITUTION/BYLAWS AMENDMENT

A proposed Hellgate ARC Constitution/Bylaws amendment to reinstate the official newsletter name as "*Hellgate Static*" will be voted upon at the May meeting.

K7VK Vick noticed that Hellgate ARC's most recent Constitution/Bylaws dated 2002 lists the official name for the newsletter as "*The Static*". However, historically the Hellgate ARC newsletters published from at least 1976 through recent times with few exceptions, have been titled the "*Hellgate Static*".

Proposal: amend the bylaws by striking the words "*The Static*" at every occurrence and replacing them with the wording "*Hellgate Static*".

Section 1: MEMBERSHIP

... Newsletter subscriptions to ~~The Static~~ the *Hellgate Static* shall be available to individuals outside the Missoula area who do not wish to participate in club activities.

Section 3: DUES AND SPECIAL ACCOUNTS

A. ... Student Members and Associate Members shall be eligible for membership at one-fifth (1/5) the rate of a Full Membership plus the cost of a subscription to the Club Newsletter, ~~The Static~~ *Hellgate Static*.

F. Every Full Member shall receive the Club Newsletter, ~~The Static~~ the *Hellgate Static*.

Result: If voted in the affirmative, the Hellgate ARC secretary will amend the Constitution/Bylaws official record, signed by appropriate HARC officers and the webmaster will post on the on the HARC website.

Celebrate Independence Day at Fort Missoula

HARC has again been invited to Fort Missoula on July 4 by the Historical Museum. This is a great opportunity for the club to demonstrate ham radio to the public, and we are gearing up for this special event. Numerous other displays, demonstrations, music, food and drink will be available for the public enjoyment.

We will have an HF station, demonstrating CW, SSB and Digital modes. W7PX is listed as a Special Event Station in QST, so we will attract plenty of attention across the country. Ham Radio Operators in the Missoula and Surrounding Area.

A search of the FCC records indicates that there are 719 active amateur radio licenses listed with Missoula addresses, zip codes of 598xx: for example Alberton, Darby, Missoula, Plains, Polson, Seeley Lake, Superior, and others. For just the city of Missoula, zip codes 5980x, there are currently 251 active call signs listed. That's a ratio of about 1:250, one in every 250 people is a licensed ham radio operator. Not bad considering the national average is closer to 1:500.
